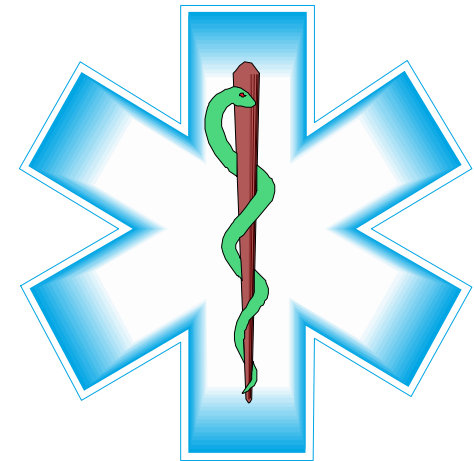

Program Overview:

An IEME sponsored course consists of 34 lessons involving approximately 139 hours of classroom & skills training, plus a hospital and field internship requiring a minimum of 5 patient assessments and 10 hours of observation. The actual number of lessons and hours of classroom time may vary.

Our curriculum exceeds both the Massachusetts Department of Public Health, Office of Emergency Medical Services and Federal Department Of Transportation's minimum requirements, and is taught by a state approved EMT Instructor/Coordinator, who is assisted by an instructional staff of many highly dedicated and qualified EMTs.

Our EMT Program is approximately 15 weeks long and runs on either a Monday & Wednesday evening schedule or on a Tuesday & Thursday evening schedule; both schedules may also have 1 or 2 or 4 Saturday Day sessions. Evening hours are from 6PM to 10PM, and Saturday hours are from 8AM to 5PM.



Program Requirements:

In order to be eligible for the state EMT certification you must meet the following requirements set by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts:

- * 18 years of age (at time of exam)
- * High School Diploma or GED
- * Read, write & speak English
- * 100% Class attendance
- * Pay State Certification Fee, Practical Exam Fee and Written Exam Fee
- * Successful completion of an approved training program
- * Chemical dependency free
- * Able to lift 125 lbs.
- * Note: certain Criminal Convictions could preclude certification

These requirements are beyond the control of IEME. Tuition does not include the State Exam Fee(s); these remain the responsibility of the student. Students that successfully complete the program are NOT required to take the Massachusetts EMT Exam, but are strongly encouraged to do so.

Do I need anything before I sign Up?

- * **NO** prior experience or training is required
- * Students will need proof of all required vaccinations, and a current TB test prior to beginning Clinical Rotations
